From the Pastor...

One King, Two Kingdoms

We are living during historic times. As you read these words, we are in the days leading up to a presidential election (or if reading later it has just passed). In an email to pastors and churches Rev. Franklin Graham, son of the late Dr. Billy Graham says, this election is "the most critical one of our lifetime. Secular forces are at work to completely change this country and remake it into a godless, lawless place." He tells of the Prayer March 2020 in Washington D.C. which he organized a few weeks ago and how amazing it was to see "tens of thousands of Christians from all across America come together for one purpose—to humble ourselves before the Lord and pray for our nation." I encourage you to pray for our nation too and to vote for those candidates who will support Biblical morality, defend our religious liberties, and seek to honor God in all that they do. In his Decision Magazine Graham identifies some of the key issues at stake in this presidential election. As conservative Christians and members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we share Graham's values: opposition to abortion on demand, religious liberty, strong national defense, law and order, the defense of traditional marriage and family, Biblical views of human sexuality, judges who follow our constitution, an economic policy which puts American's back to work. These and many other issues will be decided on November 3rd. We know that many people will be disappointed with the results. Others will rejoice that their candidates are victorious. Fear of the consequences for our nation and families is great and division in society is higher than most of us can remember. We need God's help!

The August issue of the LCMS magazine the Lutheran Witness (which was placed in your church mailbox) begins with an article entitled, "One King—Two Kingdoms". I encourage you to read it. It speaks of "the two ways which God reigns, "exclusively through the law with his left hand and through both law and Gospel with His right." The author, Robert Benne, states his desire that we have our Christian identity rooted "in the work of God's right-hand Kingdom, the Church' proclamation of the Gospel, the free gift of grace in Christ to the repentant soul." He says there is "great comfort and solidarity in uniting around the One King, Jesus Christ. He is the work of God's right hand. He is our first loyalty, the guarantee of our eternal destiny with God."

The point of this is that God continues to rule in this world through the governments that he has established or has allowed to exist (Kingdom of the Left) and also graciously rules his kingdom family, the Christian on earth and in heaven (Kingdom of the Right). We are to pray to God, as Martin Luther says in his explanation to the 4th petition of the Lord's Prayer for "devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health" and the other blessings which we need as we live and serve Him in this world. God's providential care is the reason that we need not worry but rather trust the Lord to be with us and help us, regardless of who is elected. St. Peter reminds us to "Cast your cares on Him for He cares for you". Jesus rules over all things for the sake of his Church. This is an important truth as we go past the election and deal with the consequences or changes which it may bring.

So take heart in knowing that the Lord continues to rule over this world, the Left Hand Kingdom. In this earthly kingdom people know both victory and defeat, deal with elected officials that often fail to do what they should, and too often disappoint us. Trust the Lord to bless and help you and to answer our prayers for our country. In the Kingdom of the Right Hand, the Holy Christian Church on earth and in heaven, the victory has already been won. By his death and resurrection Jesus has defeated sin, death, and the devil. He will come again to take us from this troubled world to enjoy the perfect life with God in heaven. Encourage one another with these words and remember to love one another as God in Christ has loved us. We come together at the cross where we worship One King who is over Two Kingdoms.

Christian Education—Looking Ahead

Weekday Bible Class: We plan to resume our classes in January on Tuesday's. The topic and dates will be announced.

Youth and Adult Catechism Class: We will be starting a new series of lessons on the teachings of the Lutheran Christian faith. This study of the Scriptures and the Small Catechism of Dr. Martin Luther will be called, Enduring Faith.
